Extending Care Beyond the Bedside

Finding Light After Loss

When Helen lost her adult son, Daniel, in a tragic house fire, she was left with nothing—and no one. Her Hospice team ensured a smooth transition to a nursing facility and eased the burden on staff by providing clothing and essentials so caregivers could focus on her comfort. The Pathways Center for Grief & Loss offered emotional support and Hospice arranged transportation so Helen could attend her son's funeral—reminding everyone, from family to facility staff, that compassion restores dignity and hope.

Breaking the Silence

At a retirement community, Lydia—a woman deaf since birth—faced isolation due to communication barriers. The Choices Palliative Care team arranged a trained American Sign Language interpreter for her visits, helping her express her needs and allowing caregivers to understand and support her more effectively.

A Lifetime of Love

When George, a skilled nursing resident, shared his wish to celebrate one last anniversary with his wife, Margaret, our Hospice team partnered with facility staff to make it happen. Volunteer Services organized a "card shower" with nearly 100 anniversary cards, decorated his room and arranged for a photographer to capture the day. Together, Hospice and the facility created a joyful, love-filled celebration—bringing comfort not only to George and Margaret but to every caregiver who witnessed it.

That experience changed her. Inspired by the care her family received, Emily began volunteering at The Bob Fryer & Family Inpatient Center, wanting to give others the same comfort and connection she had seen. While on leave to visit her grandmother—now in our care—Emily stood once again in the presence of that same hospice volunteer who had pinned her grandfather years before. In a moment rich with meaning, he placed a pin on her uniform, honoring her service as her grandmother looked on with pride.

It was more than a ceremony—it was a bridge between generations, a testament to love, service and the enduring bonds of care.
